Review Criteria

MEDICA®

Question

1. There is documentation that the patient has been asked about ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION, including the quantity, in the past year.
2. There is documentation that the patient who said that they drank alcohol was assessed for problem drinking by the use of a formal screening questionnaire.
3. There is documentation that the patient has been assessed for DEPRESSION symptoms by use of a depression assessment tool in the past year.
4. There is evidence or an assessment of patients EXERCISE/PHYSICAL ACTIVITY in the past year.
5. There is evidence of a comprehensive FUNCTIONAL STATUS assessment in the past year.
6. There is evidence of a PAIN assessment and the date on which it was performed during the last year.
7. There is evidence that the member is up-to-date with their MAMMOGRAM.
8. There is evidence that the member is up-to-date with their COLONOSCOPY screening.
9. There is evidence in the medical record that the patient does or does not have an ADVANCE DIRECTIVE?
10. If the member does not have an advance directive, there is documentation of an advance care planning discussion during the last year and the date on which it was discussed.

In the past year, there is a MEDICATION LIST in the medical record AND evidence of a MEDICATION REVIEW by a prescribing practitioner or clinical pharmacist and the date on which it was performed; OR notation that the member is not taking any medications and the date on which it was noted.
